

2. Reflecting on Paul's emphasis on character, which traits do you aim to cultivate? How will you intentionally develop these traits for leadership in the church or beyond?





REFLECTION AND DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

REFLECTION AND DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

2. Think of one relationship or group you're in all the time. How can you reflect Christ more clearly in how you act, speak, or show up, even when no one's asking you to?
