

In the original Greek, the word translated "hallowed" is *hagiasthētō*, meaning to set apart as holy. In fact, in the Greek text, "holy" is placed first for emphasis. When we say, "Hallowed be your name" we aren't asking God to become holy—He already is infinitely holy. Rather, we're praying that His holiness be recognized, honored, and revealed clearly on earth just as it is in heaven.

This distinction is crucial. We're not praying for God to change but for ourselves and the world around us to align with His holy nature. HOLY GROUND 99

Yet Jesus invites us to call this same God "Abba"—Father, even Daddy—drawing us into extraordinary intimacy.

When we pray "Hallowed be your name," we aren't asking God to become holy. His name is already infinitely holy. Instead, we ask for THE SACRED NAME 105

You are the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and End, Everlasting Father and Prince of Peace.


I honor You. I bless You. I magnify Your holy name.

# The Stairs

"Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights."

James 1:17

In a multilevel house, stairs connect the different floors. They enable movement, create access, and make transitions possible. In your spiritual house of prayer, the stairs represent something even greater—a holy rhythm, a dynamic relationship between your heart and heaven. Your prayers rise. God's grace descends. # Our Daily Bread

"Give us today our daily bread."

Matthew 6:11

Jesus, You embodied forgiveness on the cross. Help me embody it today. As I pray the prayer You taught us, may my heart mirror the mercy embedded in each line. Let every act of forgiveness become a bridge between heaven and earth.

# Three Rooms, Three Temptations

"And lead us not into temptation."

Matthew 6:13

Now we enter the third room on the ground floor of our house of prayer—corresponding to the petition, "Lead us not into temptation."


## Facing the Reality of Evil
